

A Powerful Deception



Franklin Graham

Senior Strategic Advisor - A Pro Trump Apologist

Franklin Graham **remains a very close advisor to the President** and often visits the West Wing to show his support. When people protest against the way ICE treats immigrants, Graham says these people are just "radical socialists" who want to destroy America. He tells his followers that the real danger is a socialist collapse, so he **ignores any moral concerns about the administration**. When the U.S. moved into Venezuela in 2026, Graham did not apologize for the violence. Instead, he called it "**Peace Through Strength**" and said the people there should be glad the "evil dictator" was gone. He never says the President is doing something wrong, and he simply asks everyone to pray that God gives the leader "wisdom" to keep taking action.



Paula White-Cain

Senior Advisor, White House Faith Office — Shielding the President

Paula White-Cain is back in charge of the White House Faith Office, where she works to **protect the President from his critics**. She uses a special kind of prayer called "spiritual warfare" to shield him from bad news. When scandals about Jeffrey Epstein or legal troubles come out, **she does not think the President needs to repent**. Instead, she says these problems are just "witchcraft" or "demonic attacks" meant to stop God's plan. She tells her followers to use their prayers to "shatter" their enemies like a clay pot. She claims that because God chose this leader, **anyone who tries to stop him is actually fighting against God**. She even says that he must rule with a "rod of iron" to keep control.



Lance Wallnau

Seven Mountain Mandate Proponent - Dominionism

Lance Wallnau is a major leader who believes Christians must take over all parts of society. He **refuses to take back his support for the President**, even when the administration does something controversial. He calls every political fight a "spirit war" against evil forces. He says that opponents are being controlled by a "Jezebel spirit" to try and make the President look weak. When the government carries out mass deportation raids, Wallnau does not call for kindness. Instead, he calls it "uprooting giants" in the Promised Land. He says the country must be "cleaned out" so that Christians can finally have a seat at the table of power. To him, **the President is a warrior-king who is doing exactly what God wants**.



The Late Charlie Kirk

Founder, Turning Point USA - "Manifest Destiny" Rhetoric

Before he was killed in September 2025, the late Charlie Kirk was a leading voice for young voters. He traveled to Greenland with the President's son to show support for taking over the land for America. He told his audience that the **country needed to act like a strong man** again instead of being "low-testosterone." Kirk **did not care about the rights of other countries or the laws of the world**. He said that trying to take Greenland and parts of Canada was a return to "Manifest Destiny". He believed it was **a holy duty to make America a global power again**. He used this idea of "masculine energy" to excuse any aggressive moves the President made before his death in Utah.



Robert Jeffress

National Faith Advisory Board — The "Cyrus" Paradigm

Robert Jeffress is a pastor from Dallas who has been **a top defender of the President for a long time**. He calls the second term a "great victory" for God. Jeffress uses stories from the Bible to explain why he still supports the leader even when scandals break. He says that the President is like King Cyrus, a leader who was not perfect but was still used by God to help His people. Jeffress thinks that personal flaws and **moral problems do**

not matter as much as the President's actions. He supports the administration because it picks conservative judges and protects the interests of the church. He believes the **President is a "fighter" who was sent to finish a specific mission for Christians.**



Eric Metaxas

Advisory Board — Dismissing Scandals as Distractions

Eric Metaxas is a popular author who is **often seen visiting the President at his home in Mar-a-Lago**. He believes that the United States is in a huge battle for its very soul. When new files about Jeffrey Epstein or other moral problems come out, Metaxas **does not ask the President to repent**. Instead, he **calls these stories "secular distractions"** that are meant to stop the spiritual mission. He stays very close to the leader and refuses to say he is wrong about his aggressive moves in other countries. He frames everything as a spiritual crusade to bring back a "Christian" culture. He tells his followers that they must never be silent because the goal of saving the nation is more important than any scandal.



Mario Murillo

7MM Strategist — Attacking Critics as "False Prophets"

Mario Murillo is a preacher **who holds huge rallies to support the MAGA movement**. He will not apologize for anything the President does, even when international leaders are upset. Instead of looking at the President's mistakes, he **attacks other Christian leaders who don't agree with him**. He calls them "false ministers" or "false prophets" and says they are being used by evil. He says the country needs a **"forceful cultural takeover"** and that the President is the only one strong enough to do it. He even **supports military moves in Venezuela and other places**, calling it part of a spiritual revival. He believes that being strong and aggressive is the only way to save the country from what he calls "godless" forces.



Jonathan Cahn

Author & Messianic Rabbi — The "Jehu" Prophetic Template

Jonathan Cahn is a rabbi and author who wrote a popular book in 2025 called The Avatar. He uses ancient Bible stories to show why he thinks the President is the right leader for today. He says the leader is **just like King Jehu, a "warrior-king"** who was very tough and even used violence to clean up his country. Cahn believes that **God chose this leader to "drain the swamp"** and get rid of corruption. Because of this, he ignores moral

scandals and threats to take over other lands. He thinks these things are all part of a divine plan for the end times. To him, the President is a "trumpet of God" who is meant to be ***a vessel for God's power on earth.***



The Late James Dobson

Focus on the Family — The "Baby Christian" Excuse


The late James Dobson was a very famous leader for families who supported the President until he died in August 2025. He often ***made excuses for the leader's past and his behavior*** by calling him a "baby Christian" who was still learning how to follow God. He believed that winning the election was the most important thing for the church. He ***ignored moral issues and scandals*** because he wanted the President to pick "pro-family" judges for the courts. He said that having a flawed leader who helps the church is much better than having a leader who disagrees with them. ***He thought the second term was a wonderful opportunity to fix the "decadent" culture and restore biblical values to the government.***



Jentezen Franklin

Religious Liberty Commission — The "Access" Justification

Jentezen Franklin is a pastor from Georgia who holds an important position on the Religious Liberty Commission. He **stays very quiet when people bring up the President's moral problems** or his threats against allies like Canada or Denmark. **He says that he continues to support the leader because the church now has "unprecedented access" to the White House.** He thinks it is a blessing from God to have a "fighter" in the Oval Office who is willing to protect the freedom of the church. He believes that being able to talk to the President and have power in the government is the best way to help Christians. **For him, keeping this influence is more important than speaking out against the leader's behavior.**



The Dangers of the Seven Mountains Mandate

The Seven Mountains Mandate is a very dangerous idea. It **turns the Gospel into a plan to take over the government by force**. This idea replaces being humble and kind with a hunger for power. It ignores the truth that Jesus said His kingdom is not of this world.
