



Finnish Sprint Orienteering Championships 2019 and World Ranking Event (WRE) in classes H21 (M21) and D21 (W21) on Sunday 22 September, 2019 in Forssa

Key points of Bulletin 2

- Traffic is guided via Highway 2 (Valtatie 2).
- Distance from parking area to event center is about 800 m.
- There is a quarantine which closes at 9.05 am in qualification and at 1.15 pm in A- and B-finals. Distance from event center to quarantine is about 1500 m and in finals 1200 m. Route is marked with red fibre tape. Coffee and tea (1€/cup) will be sold at quarantine. From quarantine there is a transport of equipment to event center.
- Number bibs and Emit control strips are at quarantine. In A-finals there will be new bibs, in B-finals same bibs as in qualification. Use your own safety pins.
- In qualification there is a prestart from where you can go to start not earlier than 15 minutes before your start time. Start / Lähtö 1 (classes H17-H35 and D17-D21) 80 m (not marked) and start / Lähtö 2 (classes H14-16, H40-85, D14-16 and D35-80) 500 m (Stora Enso –tape). In classes H80-85 and D80 start time is free.
- Classes H70-85 and D70-85 have a remote finish in qualification, from which there is a marked route (yellow tape) to event centre.
- In finals there is a prestart from where you can go to start not earlier than 25 minutes before your start time. Start / Lähtö 3 (classes H14-H50 and D14-D40) 700 m (red fibre tape) and start / Lähtö 4 (classes H55-85 and D45-80) 1100 m (Stora Enso –tape). In classes H80-85 and D80 start time is free.
- There are only loose control descriptions, which are at start area. Use your own fasteners.

Rules

The rules of Finnish Orienteering Federation (IOF), specific rules for Finnish Championships 2019, WRE rules of IOF and orders of the organisers are followed in the competition.

Competition centre

Competition centre is in Forssa Market Square and will be open at 7.00 o'clock. Entering to the competition centre only by the signposted streets from the Parking Area and from the hotels in Forssa according to the separate instructions.

Parking

All the traffic to the Parking Area is guided via the Highway 2 (Vt2). Also all driving along the Highway 10 (Vt10) will be guided to Highway 2. Traffic from south drives via Loimalammintie and all the others via Jokioistentie. The signposts must be obeyed. Signposts will be in place at 7.00 o'clock. The distance from Parking Area to the event centre is approximately 800 m, and the route is signposted. Parking is free of charge. Separate parking area for club bus. Information of the bus to Jukka Vuorentausta (jukka.vuorentausta(at)pp.surffi.net) by 15 September.

INFO (Event office)

INFO is situated in the event centre and will be open at 8.00 o'clock. INFO gives the rented Emit cards and takes the late changes to the Emit numbers. Lunch tickets can be bought and valuable things (phones, wallets etc.) can be left for guarded place in INFO during the race.

First aid

First aid tent is located in competition centre. Beside that there is a first aid group moving around the competition terrain. According to the rules everyone is obliged to help a fellow competitor who is injured in the terrain.

Club tents

Club tents are allowed to the park area near the last control which is marked for this.

Cafeterias and restaurants

There are Cafeteria, Lettulinna (pancakes), Purilaispulju (hamburgers), Puuropaari (porridge) and Rilli (barbecue) in the competition centre. The services are opened one by one after 7 o'clock. Paying with cash or cards.

Lunch is served in Forssan yhteislyseo (The Upper Secondary School of Forssa) at 10 -14. Forssan yhteislyseo is situated on the way from Parking Area to the event centre (signposts). Lunch tickets are sold in INFO.

In the quarantine area there will also be a cafe "Hermosumppila", where a cup of coffee or tea can be bought by 1 euro/cup, cash only!

Cloth changing, showers and toilets

There is no cloth changing or showers in the competition centre. Viihdekylypylä Vesihelmi (swimming hall, address Eteläinen Puistokatu 2) offers special price of 3 euros (normally 8 or 6 euros) for competitors showing their competition number. Sauna and swimming available. The route to Vesihelmi via signposted streets to Parking Area, street Yhtiönkatu, to the street Eteläinen Puistokatu.

There are toilets in the competition centre and quarantine. In the quarantine also many indoor toilets available. In the starts limited possibility to the toilets.

Childcare

Childcare is situated in the competition centre. It will be open from 8 o'clock. Children under 1 year and children with special care instructions should be informed to Mia Junnila (junniamia(at)gmail.com) by Saturday 21 September.

Terrain

Competition terrain consists of streets, walkways, pavements and paths and of the yards of houses and public buildings and of lawn based parks. Height differences are moderate but one wooded hill "Korkeavaha" is about 35 m high. Crossing the river Loimijoki is possible only via bridges.

Some busy streets are forbidden areas and crossing of them is allowed only via signposted places (see picture below). In the crossing places there are plastic cones, where competitors must go between before and after crossing.



House companies in competition area have been very positive for organizing of the competition. Please, acknowledge the map symbols of olive green yards and impassable vegetation. In the places open to interpretation, course setters have used yellow-red-tape with “stop” text to make them easier to see.

Laundry drying racks in the yards are not marked in the map. Some of them and the clothes lines are fairly low. To be more visible plastic band/tapes have been put hanging on them.

In the competition area, there are some artificial fences build for this competition. They are described in the map as impassable wall. For readability reasons, the purple marks of forbidden area are not used.

In Qualifications, the terrain will be approximately 50 % asphalt or other hard base, 40 % grass or gravel and 10 % forest. In Finals 70 % asphalt or other hard base and 30 % grass or gravel. The course setter recommends running shoes. With rainy weather also shoes with rubber studs will be useful. **Spiked or studded shoes are not allowed to use.**

Control of terrain and traffic

During the competition there will be ca 70 persons for control and stopping in the terrain. According to the rules of FOF the terrain controllers do not guide the competitors but after seeing the error they make a suggestion for rejection. The error is not possible to cancel or invalidate by the competitor, like as running back through the impassable vegetation. Same also for crossing the forbidden street. Forbidden areas and targets in the map are meant to protect the targets and the competitor.

Map

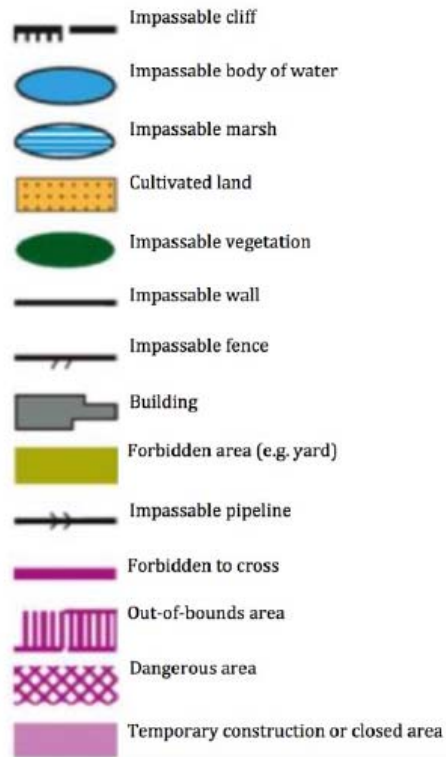
Printed (Mapline) sprint map 9 / 2019. The scale in classes H/D14 – 55 is 1:4000 and in classes H/D60 – 85 it is 1:3000. Contour interval 2 m. Map size is in the Qualification in classes H/D60-85 A3. In the Qualification of the other classes and in the Finals of all classes the map size is A4S.

Map is in the plastic cover and the competitor gets it in the moment of start. There will be no competition map for viewing available at the start. The maps are not collected in the finish.

Forbidden areas

Target which is described in the competition map as a forbidden area is not allowed to use as a route, or to go over, under or cross or to use in any other way.

List of objects in the competition map that are forbidden to cross:



On the big bridges over Loimijoki river the forbidden areas are described like in the picture below. It is allowed to run underneath the bridge via the walkways. **It is strictly forbidden to cross the bridge deck over the street although, for the sake of readability, the forbidden area is partly marked off in the map where the bridge is.** The pavements at the both sides of the road are allowed to use. Competitors breaking the rules will be disqualified!



Competition cards

Emit punch system is used in the competition. Competitors are responsible for having a fully functional Emit card with the card number submitted during the registration. The competition organizers will not check the card number before the start. Competitor using the Emit-card with wrong card number will be disqualified.

Changes of the Emit numbers shall be sent by Saturday, the 21 September, 2019 to the latest 8 pm to **risto.kivinen@resultfellows.com**. After that time a written changes of the Emit number are made at the INFO. Emit cards can be hired at the INFO for 5 euros/piece. The fee for an unreturned Emit- card is 70 euros.

Functioning of the Emit card can be checked on the Model control point near Guide post.

Start times

The start times will be published on the web site at the latest on Thursday 19 September, 2019. The start lists of the Qualifying in classes H/D21 (M/W21) are formed based on the world ranking for sprint distance on the 13 September, 2019 and online ranking of the FOF for the sprint distance on the 11 September 2019. The start lists of the Qualifications for the other classes are based on online ranking of the FOF for the sprint distance on the 11 September 2019 in accordance with the rules of FOF.

First start times for Finals of every class will be on the web site before competition.

Control descriptions

Control descriptions are available only as loose sheets in the starts. Use your own fasteners. The maximum size of the control descriptions is about 6 x 18 cm.

Competition numbers and Emit control strips

Competition numbers can be found in the Quarantine area in folders. Same number is used also in B finals but for A finals new numbers are used. Take your own safety pins! Emit control strips are available near competition numbers.

Competition numbers are taken out at 9.30 in Qualifications and at 15.00 in A finals.

GPS tracking

All competitors in H21 and D21 A finals will use GPS tracking device. The GPS vests are available in the Quarantine area and the GPS device will be slipped into the vest in start of A final. It is in the competitors own response to fetch the vest and GPS device. The devices and vests are collected in the finish area.

Quarantine

There is a quarantine both in qualifications and A and B finals.

The **quarantine of the qualification** opens at 8.30 and closes at 9.05. The distance from the Event centre to quarantine is 1500 m. The route is marked with red fibre tape. Those who arrive late to quarantine will not be allowed to take part to the competition. There is indoor space in quarantine, where indoor toilets and possibility to fill water bottles. Note that indoor area is allowed only without shoes. In the yard there are also toilets. In the quarantine area there will also be a cafe "Hermosumppila", where a cup of coffee or tea can be bought by 1 euro/cup, cash only!

The **quarantine of the finals** opens 12.15 and closes 13.15 (also A finals). The distance from the Event centre to quarantine is 1200 m. The route is marked with red fibre tape. Those who arrive late to quarantine will not be allowed to take part to the competition. There is indoor space in quarantine, where indoor toilets and possibility to fill water bottles. Note that indoor area is allowed only without shoes. In the yard there are also toilets. In the quarantine area there will also be a cafe "Hermosumppila", where a cup of coffee or tea can be bought by 1 euro/cup, cash only!

In the quarantine area, competitors are not allowed to contact anyone outside the quarantine by phone or any other instrument or to follow the competition. Coaches or other caretakers are not allowed to the quarantine area.

The organizers will transport the equipment of the competitors from the quarantine to the Event centre. You can leave your bag equipped with your competition number to the trailer before you leave for the start. The bags can be picked up in Event centre.

In the quarantine there is a **Prestart**, through which competitors go to the start. You can leave the Prestart at earliest 15-25 minutes before your start time (more precise instruction coming later for every start) but also later. Competitors in classes H/D80-85 may leave freely to their own start. Once you have passed the Prestart you are not allowed to return to quarantine area.

Start arrangements

3 min before start:

- calling by start time, no names are called
- picking the control descriptions (loose sheets, not printed in the map).

2 min before the start:

- clearing the Emit card

1 min before the start:

- go to the maps bucket of you own class

0 min: Start

- make sure that you take right map

Special instructions for the qualifications

The **quarantine of qualification** opens at 8.30 and closes at 9.05. The distance from the Event centre to quarantine is 1500 m. The route is marked with red fibre tape. Some big streets will be crossed but the traffic should be quiet on Sunday morning. Those who arrive late to quarantine will not be allowed to take part to the competition.

Start 1

Start 1 is situated close to quarantine (80 m). Start 1 can be seen from the prestart and there is no marking. Start area is rather limited, so warm up in the quarantine area and leave Prestart just before your start time call (3 min before start).

Start 2

The distance to the Start 2 from the quarantine is about 500 m. The route is marked with white Stora Enso plastic tape. In the quarantine there is a Prestart, through which competitors go to the start. You can leave the Prestart at earliest 15 minutes before your start time, but later leave is also possible. Competitors in classes H/D80-85 may leave freely to their own start. Once you have passed the Prestart you are not allowed to return to quarantine area.

Special instructions for the finals

The **quarantine of the finals** opens 12.15 and closes 13.15 (also A finals). The distance from the Event centre to quarantine is 1200 m. The route is marked with red fibre tape. Those who arrive late to quarantine will not be allowed to take part to the competition.

Start 3

The distance to the Start 3 from the quarantine is about 700 m. The route is marked with red fibre tape. In the quarantine there is a Prestart, through which competitors go to the start. You can leave the Prestart at earliest 25 minutes before your start time, but later leave is also possible. Once you have passed the Prestart you are not allowed to return to quarantine area.

All competitors in H21 (M21) and D21 (W21) in A finals will use GPS tracking device. The GPS vests are available in the quarantine area and the GPS device will be slipped into the vest in the start of A final. It is in the competitors own response to fetch the vest and GPS device. The devices and vests are collected in the finish area.

Same courses are run in A and B finals per class except in classes H/M21, D/W21 and H45.

Start 4

The distance to the Start 4 from the quarantine is about 1100 m. The route is marked with white Stora Enso plastic tape. In the quarantine there is a Prestart, through which competitors go to the start. You can leave the Prestart at earliest 25 minutes before your start time, but later leave is also possible. Competitors in classes H/D80-85 may leave freely to their own start. Once you have passed the Prestart you are not allowed to return to quarantine area.

Same courses are run in A and B finals per class.

The starts are closed both in the qualifications and in the finals 5 min after last start time.

Remote finish

In the qualification the classes H70 K1, H70 K2, D70 K1, H75 K1, D75 K1, H80 K1, D80 K1 and H85 K1 will use remote finish where the course ends and timekeeping stops. The way from the remote finish to the emit card reading is marked with the yellow fibre tape. This emit reading is common for every class.

Closing the Finish

The Finish is closed in the Qualification 36 min and in the Finals 30 minutes after last start time. Finish may be closed even earlier if all competitors have finished. Competitors that don't finish the whole race must contact the finish.

Complaints

Complaints must be delivered in written form to the INFO within 15 minutes concerning the WRE classes (M21 and W21) and for other classes within 30 minutes after the end of the race. Qualifications and Finals are two different races. More information in the rules of FOF and IOF.

Prize giving ceremony

Prize giving ceremony will be in Market square Paviljonki according to the schedule.

The three best A finalists in every class will be awarded a Finnish Championship medal. In the classes H/D14-21 competitors in places 4-10 and in the classes H/D35-70 places 4-6 will be awarded with plagues. In the classes H/D75-85 no plagues will be awarded according to the orienteering rules. No prizes will be awarded in the B-finals.

Besides the Championship medals the first three competitors get a bag full of local food.

In the official Finnish Championship result list will be take orienteers who are Finnish citizens and represent a club which is a member of IOF or those foreigners who have lived permanently in Finland (home place in Finland) from the beginning of the competition year and who represent a member club of FOF. Those persons should have Finnish licence valid at registration.
