





The WEEE Forum, set up in 2002, is a Brussels-based European not-for-profit association speaking for 34 not-for-profit WEEE producer compliance schemes – alternatively referred to as ‘producer responsibility organisations’ (PRO).

Based in Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Czechia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Italy, France, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Lithuania, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

It is the biggest organisation of its kind in the world.

In 2016, its member organisations reported collection and proper de-pollution and recycling of 2,100,000 tonnes of WEEE.




